- 25-26 From the editor, from the board, includes report of celebration of 50th Anniversary of Study Group
- 27-32 **The 'Formosa Republic' on Taiwan** existed a few months in 1895 but left a philatelic legacy. The stamps and their use are discussed. There is no evidence of any actual postal activity organized by the Republic.
- 33-37 **Tannu Tuva** was part of Mongolia before 1911 and gained independence from Russia in 1921. The postal activities were very limited, but from 1926-36 a range of colourful stamps were issued, followed by some emergency issues in the years up to 1944, when the state was dissolved and absorbed by the Soviet Union.
- 37 **Commemorative sheetlets** showing cats
- 38-39 **China in an afternoon** is the summary of the lecture held at the 50th Anniversary celebration of the group.
- 40-41 **Tie-prints and a faked letter** shows the use of tie-prints as a security measure. On the second letter shown (from 1944) a \$5 stamp was replaced by a 30 c stamp (issued 1946) which is very rare to find used.
- 42 **Commemorative sheetlets** showing flowers and the city of Liaocheng
- 43 **Commemorative cancels from the Liberated Areas** used before the time of the PRC are shown; original article in China Philately (July 1987)
- 44-46 **New issues PRC**
- 46 **New issues Hong Kong post**
- 47-48 **New issues Taiwan (ROC)**
