- 1-2 From the editor, from the board
- 3-7 **Cancels on Coiling Dragon stamps:** the various types of cancels seen on these stamps are shown and discussed, including a guide to moon calendar cancels
- 8-9 **French Ship-Airmail post from Shanghai** is shown, used as service for French military personnel. The post, cancelled on board the French ships, is forwarded by air mail at first opportunity.
- 9-14 **Honoured Chinese – Lin Biao: military genius to fallen crown prince** describes the career of Lin Biao, his rise to power and his downfall in 1971, followed by a posthumous reevaluation from the 1990s onward. He appears on rare unissued stamps.
- 14-15 **Honoured Chinese – exemplary women** honored on 1978 stamps: Xiang Jingyu and Yang Kaihui both were early victims of ‘white terror’. Yang was also the first wife of Mao Zedong, her appearance on stamps marked the end of the Cultural Revolution, when the ‘Gang of Four’ made it taboo to mention her.
- 16-17 **Some interesting modern covers** are shown, Bank covers from Xinjiang with bilingual text and postmarks and a local letter in Yiwu, franked with a commemorative sheet issued by the Chinese Railways.
- 18-19 **Tokio I.J.P.O – an addendum** to the article on these cancels in issue # 213 shows these cancels were in use on international post in Tokio in 1897-98. It also shows the sequence of other cancels used for the same purpose.
- 20-21 **Birds and plants on recent stamps** discusses the background of the species shown on recently issued stamps from PRC and Taiwan.
